

The Technical Consultation on Perinatal Mental Health in India

20th June 2023, NIMHANS Convention Centre, NIMHANS, Bangalore

Every 1 in 5 pregnant women in India suffer from Perinatal Mental Health (PMH) issues in one or the other form. In an effort to address this critical issue of PMH and support the well-being of mothers and families, Jhpiego in collaboration with National Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences (NIMHANS) has organized "The Technical Consultation on Perinatal Mental Health in India" on 20th June 2023 at NIMHANS, Bangalore. This was the first of its kind meeting with agenda of PMH that brought together almost all the stakeholders, right from state & district Govt. officials, USAID, academicians, domain experts, healthcare professionals, FOGSI, policymakers, psychologists, social work, NGO representatives and others.

The meeting served as an important platform to discuss the Roses (good practices), Buds (opportunity) and Thorns (challenges) surrounding Perinatal mental health, an area of utmost importance for the wellbeing of mothers, children and families. It delved into important topics that involve PMH with regard to Policy and programs, Clinical areas, community interventions and implementation strategies. The meeting drew many national experts underscoring the widespread recognition of the importance of the topic. The meeting provided a platform for healthcare professionals and organizations to showcase their initiatives and share their learnings and success stories in this domain.

Prof. Dr Prabha Chandra, Dean- NIMHANS and a renowned global authority on PMH shed light on the significance of early detection, prevention, and intervention and emphasized the need for a comprehensive approach that involves healthcare providers, support networks, and the wider community. **Dr Parag Bhamare**, Country Lead for MNCH, Jhpiego shared the details of the ongoing implementation research project on PMH that Jhpiego is rolling out in Madhya Pradesh. A lot of interest was expressed by the other private and public sector representatives to initiate similar projects in their geographies. **Dr Sachin Gupta**, Advisor MNCH, USAID appreciated the efforts of Jhpiego and expressed his commitment to furthering the cause.

At the diverse and insightful sessions, the importance of breaking down stigma and creating a safe space for open conversations about mental health during pregnancy and the postpartum period resonated deeply with attendees, fostering empathy and understanding.

This aspect of the event was instrumental in connecting individuals with appropriate resources and establishing a robust network of support within the community.

We look forward to translating the ideas and initiatives generated during this meeting into tangible improvements for mothers, families, and their mental well-being. 
